The Next Generation Schools Program is a community engagement initiative that has been facilitated by the Petroleum Club of Western Australia since 1991.

The Program consists of 4 mentor visits throughout the year, plus the Student Expo Day which is held in November.

During each mentor visit, students will learn about the positive impact the oil and gas industry has on our society, meet with various industry professionals and participate in various interactive experiments/ activities.

The program culminates in the Student Expo Day were students are invited to visit interactive displays and generate points through completion of industry related activities, games and guizzes. The aim is to generate interest and facilitate the guestion & answer process between students and industry representatives.

Students will break into their teams, visiting each of the interactive displays set up around the university campus. The highest scoring teams at the end of the day are awarded with the fantastic prizes we receive from our sponsors.

Target Audience

The objective of the Next Generation program is to introduce year 8–10 students to the oil and gas industry in a fun, interactive and educational environment.

Goals

Students get first hand access to information from someone working directly in the industry. This program provides an opportunity to inspire the next generation and to promote the oil and gas industry to our future workforce.

Success

In 2020 we had over 600 students from 16 schools participate in the program, including regional schools Dongara, Carnamah and Jurien Bay District High Schools and Busselton Senior High School. Many of these schools have been involved with our program for several years and continue to come back year after year.





























Program Breakdown & Schedule

Visit One - Introduction to the Oil & Gas Industry

The first mentor session provides students with an introduction to the oil and gas industry and highlights the positive impact it has on our society. This visit includes an interactive activity to grasp what the students already know about the industry.

Visit Two - Project Life Cycle & Careers

The second visit focuses on the project life cycle and starts to showcase the diverse range of careers required to complete the project, may of which they wouldn't have considered. The visits activity for this session focuses on the different disciplines within a project. Each team will be given a different experiment to complete and afterwards they'll need to relay back to the rest of class their task and any troubles they experienced.

Visit Three - The Future of Energy

The third visit focuses Renewable energy developments, the future mix of energy, how all the different energy sources work and that the benefits are of each source. There will be an interactive activity for all students to take part in as part of the session.

Visit Four - Panel Session

The third visit is a career's panel, where 3-4 mentors from various backgrounds and disciplines shared their career journey within the oil and gas industry. This provides more insight into the diverse range of careers available, as well as the various paths taken to achieve them.

STUDENT EXPO DAY

The program culminates in the Student Expo Day were students are invited to visit interactive displays and generate points through completion of industry related activities, games and quizzes. The overall aim is to generate interest and facilitate the question and answer process between students and industry representatives.
